






Open the Settings app, select Cellular, then tap "Add eSIM".




Tap "Use QR Code."



Scan the QR code.

If you are unable to scan the QR code, tap "Enter Details Manually."



If entering details manually, input the "SM-DP+ Address" and "Activation Code" from the eSIM delivery email. The confirmation code is not required.



Tap "Continue."




The status will change to "Activating." Please wait until the screen updates.


## [For iPhone] eSIM Installation Guide - Step 2

## Make sure you're connected to a stable Wi-Fi network before continuing.







When the screen changes, tap "Done."




The eSIM will be added to Cellular while it shows "Activating..."
By default, it will be added under categories such as "Personal," "Travel," "Work," or "Secondary Line."



After a short while, the "Activating..." message will disappear. You can rename the eSIM in Settings to something like "For Travel."



Even if it says "Unable to Activate" because the local carrier cannot be reached, the eSIM is still installed in Cellular, so there is no problem.




After arriving, switch your "Cellular Data" to this eSIM.

1. Keep "Allow Cellular Data Switching" turned off.

2. You can leave the voice line as your primary line, but if you won't use international calls or SMS, it's

recommended to turn it off.



Turn on "Data Roaming" to start using the internet.
